

Call to Artists: Blush at the SALEM ARTS ASSOCIATION Gallery

In July, the Salem Arts Association (SAA) celebrates the Salem Theatre Company's July production of Steve Martin's farce *The Underpants* - with *Blush*.

- A coating defect consisting of the whitening of a cured film which results in a translucent or opaque appearance with accompanying loss of gloss.
- Having a red face from embarrassment or shame or agitation or emotional upset
- A wine made from red grapes but which appears pink or salmon in color because the grape skins were removed from the fermenting juice before more color could be imparted; more commonly referred to as rosé
- Refers to a different color overlay of the base color of a flower., ie a red blush
- To express or make known

Exhibit Dates: <u>Blush</u> will run from Friday, July 3 to Sunday, July 26. Accepted work must remain with the exhibit until the exhibit closes. The artists' reception is Saturday, July 11 from 4P.M. to 7P.M..

Exhibit Location: The SAA Gallery is located in Salem's Artist Row at 24 New Derby Street, in Salem. Parking is available adjacent to the Gallery in Klop Alley.

Work Sought: All artists are invited to submit up to two (2) works. Works may be in any medium and include 2-D, 3-D, sculptural works, photography, mixed media, crafts and experimental works. WE REGRET THAT WE ARE UNABLE TO ACCOMMODATE INSTALLATIONS.

Entries will be juried from original work only. All 2-dimensional work must be wired for hanging.

Size Limitations: 18" x 24" (any direction) for 2-D work. A limited number of pedestals are available for sculptural work.

Eligibility: Open to all artists 18+ (SAA Student Artist Member work is eligible for entry regardless of age).

Entry Fee: SAA Artist Members: No Entry Fee / Non-Members: \$10 (for up to two pieces)

Commission: SAA Artist Members will pay 20% commission to the SAA on works sold,

Non-member artists will pay a 40% commission to the SAA on works sold.

Artwork Drop-Off: Sunday, June 28 from Noon to 6p.m. and Monday, June 29th from 7p.m. to 8p.m. at the SAA Gallery, 24 New Derby Street, Unit 1, Salem, MA. IN PERSON DROP-OFF and PICK-UP ONLY. UNSOLICITED MAIL WILL NOT BE RETURNED.

Acceptance Notification: Artists will be notified by **e-mail** <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 30th</u>.

Work Not Accepted: Must be picked up on Wednesday, July 1st, from 6 pm - 8 pm at the SAA Gallery in Artist Row.

Pick-Up of Unsold Work: Sunday, July 26 from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. OR Monday, July 27 from 7p.m. to 8 p.m. at the SAA Gallery in Artist Row. IN PERSON PICK-UP ONLY. No works will be mailed.

Insurance: Works of Fine Art and Craft with a value under \$1000 are insured for catastrophic loss only. Works with a value of over \$1000 are not insured by the SAA. Artists' must provide their own insurance if they wish additional coverage.

All work MUST be picked up! We have NO storage.

The SAA will assess a \$5.00 per day fee on all artwork not retrieved by the specified pick-up deadline. The SAA is not responsible for work damaged, lost, or stolen, after the pick-up date.

Dan Browne Artist Statement

I have been working with found objects for about 20 years. It started when I dismantled the first VCR I ever owned, creating a robot (aptly named the Patriarch).

My sculptures are primarily made from metals, although I will use plastics, wood or other materials as fitting. Most of my creations are one of a kind but I have designed a few which are relatively repeatable. They vary in size from a few inches to a six foot kangaroo that my wife and I designed for consignment and is now proudly displayed in Topsfield.

Over the years I have accumulated a large collection of pieces obtained from friends, flea markets and tag sales, recycling yards and of course dumpster diving.

I find myself looking at found objects or other people's trash as potential eyes, noses, mouths, etc. In this effort I create a unique whole from the parts. Sometimes it starts with a specific piece that I must build a sculpture around. Other times a concept arises and I need to fill in the details. Many an hour is spent despairing over minute details until I feel the piece is complete. (I've got to get a life)

I have been an active member of the Salem Arts Association for the last 2 years participating in the seasonal gallery as well as themed shows and open studios. I have contributed to the Marblehead Festival of the Arts for years, earning awards for outstanding work and honorable mention. I have exhibited in several galleries and shops in Salem and had a brief stint on Newbury St. in Boston.
